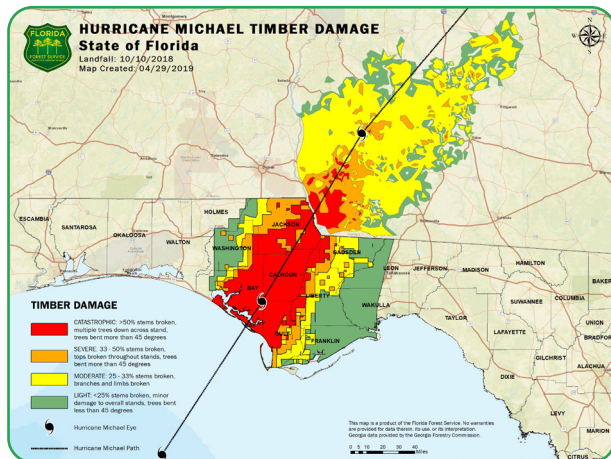


HURRICANE MICHAEL TIMBER RECOVERY BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATIONS STILL BEING ACCEPTED



Registration for the Florida Timber Recovery Block Grant Program is available to forest landowners who suffered damage from Hurricane Michael in October 2018. The original registration deadline was November 20, 2020, but applications submitted after that date will be considered if funding is available.

FMCSA PROPOSED YOUNG DRIVER PILOT PROGRAM

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) published a proposed pilot program earlier this fall that would allow younger drivers between 18 and 20 to operate commercial motor vehicles (CMVs) across state lines.

Currently, 49 states and the District of Columbia allow 18, 19, and 20-year-olds to drive trucks *within* state lines. These same drivers, however, are not allowed to drive a CMV on the interstate. The pilot program is modeled off of the DRIVE Safe Act. The proposed pilot program will allow the FMCSA to examine the safety, feasibility, and potential economic benefits of allowing 18 to 20-year-old drivers to operate on the interstate.

USDA SEEKS PUBLIC INPUT ON GUIDANCE DEFINING NONINDUSTRIAL PRIVATE FOREST LAND ELIGIBILITY

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is seeking public input on Nonindustrial Private Forest Land (NIPF) related to technical and financial assistance available through conservation programs of USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

"We want to ensure we continue program consistency across USDA agencies with how we are defining nonindustrial private forest lands," said Juan Hernandez, NRCS State Conservationist in Florida. "It's important that our conservation assistance reach all eligible lands in accordance with proper criteria to ensure we enroll eligible lands that hold meaningful opportunities."

Nonindustrial private forest land criteria will be adopted after the close of the 30-day period and after consideration of all comments. NRCS invites input on this technical guidance through January 19, 2021. Electronic comments must be submitted through [regulations.gov](https://www.regulations.gov) under Docket ID NRCS-2020-0009. All written comments received will be publicly available online at [Regulations.gov](https://www.regulations.gov).

REMINDER: CDL DRUG AND ALCOHOL CLEARINGHOUSE

For those in the forestry community who either work as or employ CDL drivers, it is important to review the requirements for your drug and alcohol testing program and to register for the Drug & Alcohol Clearinghouse.

To stay in compliance and help support their efforts ...

CDL employers must:

- **Register.** *Everyone who employs a CDL driver must register, including those without a DOT number.*
- Run a query on existing employees by the end of 2020.

Those holding CDL licenses must:

- **Register** with the clearinghouse in order to authorize queries by employer.

TREEPAC SUCCESS

TREEPAC, the Association's political action committee, contributed \$61,000 to 65 candidates in the 2020 election cycle. Ultimately, an impressive 58 of those candidates were successful in their bid for office.

TREEPAC Chair Avery Roberts attributed TREEPAC's success to the support of Association members: "Once again, support from our members made it possible for TREEPAC to help elect candidates who will work to protect our ability to grow, harvest and use Florida's forest resources," he said.

SENATOR BRADLEY SEES FORESTRY STORY IN ACTION

Focusing on the economic impacts of Florida's forest industry throughout the district's 11-county area, tour stops included a logging and site-prep operation by Usher Land & Timber and a sawmill tour at Cross City Lumber.

WAYNE SMITH TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA AGRICULTURAL HALL OF FAME



Please join us in congratulating longtime Association member Wayne Smith for being selected for induction into the Florida Agricultural Hall of Fame.

Dr. Smith's contributions to Florida agriculture encompass his lifelong devotion to education and research and forestry passion. Smith, a native of Marianna, Florida and graduate of the University of Florida, returned to his alma mater in 1964, advancing through the academic ranks as a professor, director, and finally, professor emeritus. In retirement, he served as interim dean for UF/IFAS Research and the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences. He proved to be a groundbreaking educator, researcher, and administrator.

Smith played a crucial part in developing and implementing the first Best Management Practices (BMPs) for silviculture. BMPs soon spread across Florida's agricultural industry and changed the face of agriculture. His research in fertilization led to practices that increased pine forest productivity by up to 300%. And his pioneering work in bio-energy made Florida a leader and earned accolades from the U.S. Department of Energy. Smith's work has been recognized around the globe, including an audience with royalty. He has been a consultant for the United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization and has been called upon to testify before Congress.

The induction ceremony was originally scheduled to be held at the annual Florida Agricultural Hall of Fame Banquet at the Florida State Fair in Tampa in February 2021. Last week it was announced that the state fair has been postponed until sometime in April due to COVID-19, so the banquet will be delayed as well.

Tickets for the banquet will cost \$75 each. They will be available for purchase through the Florida Agricultural Hall of Fame website at FloridaAgHallofFame.org in the near future. We will keep you posted as plans progress.

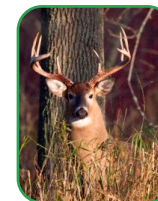
