### LEGISLATIVE WRAP-UP

Highlights of the 2023 state legislative session:

**Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services:** SB 1164 (Sen. Collins) / HB 1279 (Rep. Alverez): This legislation, also referred to as "the agency package," contains a broad list of clean-up clarifications and modernizations within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Of specific interest to Association members, both the Senate and House bills create the Florida Farm TEAM card. Similar in concept to the Georgia GATE card, the Farm Team card would enable agriculture producers to present the card at time of purchase to receive the sales-tax exemptions on items used in agriculture which are exempt from sales-tax. The Farm Team Card presents a significant opportunity to modernize and enhance efficiency for agricultural and silvicultural operations as the card would replace the certification and affidavit forms producers are currently required to file with a retailer in order to receive the sales-tax exemptions to which they are entitled.

**Immigration (SB 1718):** This legislation, which was a priority of Governor DeSantis, updates several sections of Florida law. Most notably the new law requires all business entities with more than 25 employees to verify employment eligibility of \*new\* hires using E-Verify. Governor DeSantis has already signed this bill into law. It will become effective July 1, 2023.

The Association opposes this legislation because it creates undue, burdensome regulations by, at a minimum, placing employer hiring decisions in the hands of an unreliable federal database system.

**Taxation (HB 7063):** The legislature spent the last several weeks of session negotiating a sweeping tax overhaul which included a sales tax exemption for materials used to construct or repair permanent or temporary fencing to contain, confine, or process cattle. Most notably, however, the package **prohibits local municipalities from levying special assessments on agricultural land.** This specific piece of the larger tax package was a priority for Commissioner of Agriculture Wilton Simpson, the Association, and the agricultural industry at large.

Interest of Foreign Countries (SB 264): The focus of this legislation has popped up around the country in various forms and fashions. Shortly after the November election, several Florida elected officials, including Commissioner Simpson, held public events expressing an interest in prohibiting ownership of agricultural lands by foreign countries. To be clear, as defined in this legislation, the foreign countries which are the focus of the bill are defined as "foreign countries of concern" and are listed as the People's Republic of China, the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the Republic of Cuba, the Venezuelan regime of Nicolás Maduro, or the Syrian Arab Republic, including any agency of or any other entity of significant control of such foreign country of concern.

This legislation would, among other things, prohibit any individual, partnership, corporation or other individual or business organizations located in or owned by an individual or other business instrument tied to a Foreign Country of Concern from purchasing agricultural land.

Agricultural Lands SB 1184 (Sen. Collins) /HB 1343 (Rep. Tuck): As amended, this legislation prohibits the levy of any special assessment of lands classified as agriculture; authorizes construction or installation of housing for agricultural employees on agricultural lands; prohibits local governments from adopting land use or zoning restrictions, conditions, or regulations that require termination or surrender of agricultural classifications for certain property; and authorizes the use of portable restrooms as permanent facilities on agricultural lands.

This legislation **failed** on day 60 of session, yet some of its pieces found their way into other bills which passed this session.

**Trespassing SB 648 (Sen. Collins)/ HB 933 (Rep. Alverez):** This legislation would have opened another pathway for agricultural lands to be "posted" for the purposes of Florida's trespass laws. Specifically, the bills would have given an agricultural landowner the ability to only post at a point of ingress and the corner boundaries of the property. The legislation would not have changed the existing rules or parameters which agricultural landowners follow today for purposes of "posting" their lands but would have provided an alternative for future legal posting.

This legislation **failed** to pass both chambers.

**Organic Material SB 1472: (Sen. Bradley)/ HB 1361 (Rep. Truenow):** This legislation would have prohibited local governments from adopting any ordinance,

regulation, rule, or policy to prohibit, restrict, regulate, or otherwise limit collection, storage, processing, or distribution of organic material products and provided that such activities are bona fide farm operation & lands associated with such activities are agricultural.

This legislation **failed** to pass both chambers.

#### **Budget**:

#### **FDACS**

During the legislative session, the Florida Forestry Association enjoys the opportunity to work with the Department and the legislature on key appropriations requests from the Florida Forest Service specifically and the Department generally. The 2023 Session provided many budget success stories which are a reflection of the respect the legislature has for Commissioner Simpson and his staff. The Association wishes to thank Commissioner Simpson and the Florida legislature for their commitment to these key budget items.

There was continued robust support for the **Fresh From Florida Program** (\$17 million). In addition, the legislature invested \$100 million in the **Rural and Family Lands Program.** 

Specifically within the Florida Forest Service, the legislature provided:

- o \$4.1 Million Road, Bridges and Maintenance;
- o \$12 Million for Replacement Fire Equipment;
- o \$1.4 Million for the acquisition of (2) **Fixed-wing** aircraft; and
- o \$4 Million for **Reforestation.**

Furthermore, the legislature provided the Department with the budget authority to spend the remainder of a \$97 million appropriation from 2022 which was designed to fund **Wildfire Suppression Activities**.

Lastly, the legislature also provided the Department the authority to spend the remaining balance of **Reforestation** funds which were allocated in 2022.

#### <u>FDEP</u>

Through the Working Forest Partnership and other groups, the Association often lends support where appropriate on budget items of importance to our many partners. Most specifically, the Association is pleased that the legislature continued funding at the \$50 million level for **Springs Restoration** projects. In addition, the legislature included \$100 million for the **Florida Forever Program.** 


#### **BMP IMPLEMENTATION SURVEY RESULTS**

For the 2021 Silviculture Best Management Practices (BMP) Implementation Survey, foresters with the Florida Forest Service evaluated 3,490 practices on 155 individual forestry operations (sites). This cooperative effort involved 79 individual public and private landowners and covered 18,859 acres in 37 Florida counties. Of the visited sites, 125 were located on private non-industrial, 11 on industrial, and 19 on public forest lands.

Eighty-five percent of the sites surveyed were 100% compliant with all applicable Silviculture BMPs. No site scored below 82% for its overall BMP implementation rate. The average overall Silviculture BMP compliance rate for all sites was 99.1%, a slight decrease from 99.7% in 2019.

### **RURAL AND FAMILY LANDS** PROTECTION PROGRAM





The Rural and Family Lands Protection Program is an agricultural land preservation program designed to protect important agricultural lands through the acquisition of permanent agricultural land conservation easements.

The program partners with farmers and ranchers through conservation easements and aims to safeguard working agricultural operations that contribute significantly to the state's economy and production of food and fiber.

Simpson helped secure \$400 million in funding for the program over the last two years.

## FEDERAL PROTECTION FOR **HOGNOSE SNAKE IN FUTURE?**



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has agreed to reconsider extending Endangered Species Act protections to the nonvenomous southern hognose snake.

The **Center for Biological Diversity** petitioned the Fish and Wildlife Service in 2012 to protect the snake, which inhabits Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina. In 2015, the service announced that, based on the best available science, protections for the tiny snake "may be warranted." In 2019, the service reversed course, denying the snake endangered species status and the protections that come with it. The center filed a lawsuit in U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in January challenging the 2019 decision. As a result, Fish and Wildlife agreed to re-evaluate and make a new decision by August 2025.
